# The Best Ways To Take A Nap

Naps don't just feel amazing – they are amazing. A study published in the journal *Heart* found a link between healthy napping and a lowered risk of heart disease. The American Psychological Association points out that naps can improve memory, learning capacity, immune system function and mood. Cognitive neuroscientist Professor Sara Mednick and author of *The Power of the Downstate*, explains that when you fall asleep, your body moves through stages that each play a role in health:

**STAGE 1:** the 'dozing off' period;  
**STAGE 2:** muscles, heart rate and brain activity slow down;  
**STAGE 3:** deep, restorative sleep;  
**STAGE 4:** REM (rapid eye movement) sleep, when brain activity increases and you're most likely to dream.

Ideal napping times are based around this four-stage cycle.

**THE 20-MINUTE NAP** Between 20 and 30 minutes is a napping sweet spot, says Mednick, as you get enough Stage 2 sleep to switch your body and mind into full relaxation mode, helping boost memory.

**THE 60-MINUTE NAP** Stage 3 sleep is a time for your body to repair tissue, fortify the immune system and recharge energy stores. But waking up during this phase can make you feel groggy, Mednick says. Most people start to move out of Stage 3 after around 60 minutes, which makes it a good time to set your alarm.

**THE 90-MINUTE NAP** A complete sleep cycle is about an hour and a half, and napping for a full cycle can have big benefits. But naps longer than 90 minutes can interfere with nighttime sleep and might even impair memory retention, according to a study in the *Journal of the American Geriatrics Society*. Not a regular napper? That's OK. "Everyone needs to rest, but not everyone necessarily needs to nap," says Mednick.

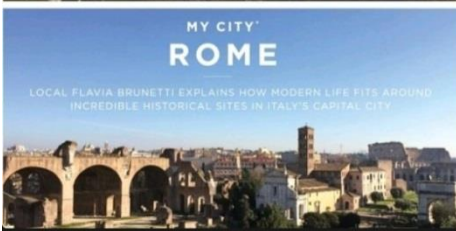

### Where are your favourite places to gather with friends?

In spring, it's warm enough to sit outside, so we head to Hotel de Russie, with its lovely courtyard, for evening drinks or for tea. I also love brunch at Marigold. It's less-traditional Italian food, so there's multicultural cuisine and delicious homemade sourdough.

### Tell us about eating in your city

Food is a religion in Rome. Every region in Italy has its specialities. A few favourites across the city are the four classic pastas: amatriciana, carbonara, cacio e pepe and gricia. They share the key flavours of pecorino Romano and black pepper, and most contain pork, too. A little advice: don't eat by the famous landmarks; go for local recommendations or spots away from tourist areas.

### What's your favourite way to get about the city?

Rome's public transport is not easy to use, as it tends to be unreliable (especially the buses) and crowded (the metro). It's more expensive, but to see something like the

ancient with the new every day and somehow makes it work. Cars squeal by the Colosseum and your morning commute takes you past pieces of history that have shaped the world. Millions of people make their home in this open-air museum full of riotous colour, chaos and carbonara (let's not forget the food). Rome is burdened by slow-moving bureaucracy and chaotic organisation, so it can be a difficult place to live, but I've never heard anybody come here and not feel compelled to return.

### What's it like in spring?

Spring feels new. There's often a crisp chill in the air, or rain showers that leave you feeling as if the city has been washed clean and must be explored all over again. Spring is best seen on foot, walking through Piazza di Spagna, down Via del Babuino, over to the Pantheon, the roads that span out from the Colosseum, from the Roman Forum down to Piazza Venezia and further down to Teatro Marcello. Even as a local, these walks still leave me breathless. But it's not just about the big historical landmarks, there are everyday wonders, too: the *suppli* (stuffed rice, mozzarella and sauce balls) that are sold in the small shops, often by the

many of the big attractions, such as the Colosseum, pre-buying a smaller guided visit online allows you to cut the queue. That's especially useful if you're visiting during high season, but early spring is usually quieter, and it's one of the prettiest times of year to visit.

### What's been your best discovery about your city?

A city teeming with history, culture and art can be overwhelming. But the thing about Rome is that there's always something that touches you. A moment, or a place, or a sight. A ray of evening light, an Italian word you recognise, the place that makes cornetti (croissants) at 3am, so the scent follows you for the rest of the day.

### What do you miss most if you've been away?

Early morning walks near the Mura Aureliane, the walls that were the marker of Ancient Rome. Before the day has started, before I'm fully awake, for just a second, I feel I belong to this city and, if she's feeling particularly generous, that she belongs to me, too.
